Fifth Sunday of Lent

Lent and the Lord's Prayer

During the six Sundays of Lent, we will continue to look at the teachings of Jesus in Matthew's gospel; linking them to the way that Jesus taught his disciples to pray:

Our Father who art in heaven, **hallowed be thy name**. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory, forever.

Matthew 25:31-40

³¹ “When the Son of Man comes in his glory and all the angels with him, then he will sit on the throne of his glory. ³² All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, ³³ and he will put the sheep at his right hand and the goats at the left. ³⁴ Then the king will say to those at his right hand, ‘Come, you who are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world, ³⁵ for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, ³⁶ I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.’ ³⁷ Then the righteous will answer him, ‘Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food or thirsty and gave you something to drink? ³⁸ And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you or naked and gave you clothing? ³⁹ And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?’ ⁴⁰ And the king will answer them, ‘Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did it to me.’

SECOND SCRIPTURE READING

Matthew 25:41-46

One: We pray, “Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.”

All: We confess that we see these words only in spiritual terms, while the Bible is filled with teachings about economic justice and Creation care.

One: We pray, “Save us from the time of trial.”

All: Help us to resist the temptations of spending more, using more, acquiring more and wasting more.

One: We pray, “Deliver us from evil...”

All: Free us from greed and self-centeredness that separate us from you and others.

One: We pray, “For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours now and forever.”

All: Help us to know that in caring for your wonderful world, we are working for your kingdom, being good stewards of your creative power and giving you glory.

One: Silently or aloud, let us present our requests to God...We pray, “Amen.”

All: We end our prayers with “Amen,” a word that means “let it be so.” We know we can be faithful disciples by your grace. Amen!

2023 Lenten Devotional – Examen: Inward Work for Outward Living



This daily Lenten devotional is written by Teri McDowell Ott, editor of Presbyterian Outlook, and explores the ancient spiritual practice of examen that focuses on honest assessment and reflection. With a different theme for each week of Lent, readers are invited to explore the connection between internal contemplation and outward action.

Themes include examining our fear to live with faith; examining our pain to live with healing; examining our dishonesty to live with truth; examining our joy to live with gratitude; examining our love to live with heart; and examining our burdens to live with blessing.

Each daily reflection will combine personal reflection with meditation, visualization, and short prayers. The prayers can be used as mantras or breath prayers: breathe in praying the first phrase, breathe out praying the last.

Each Sunday worship service during Lent will, also, include a short time of meditation and examen. Printed devotions are available, and will be included in the weekly email – or can be accessed online as an e-book.
