Maundy Thursday / Tenebrae Service **Service of Holy Communion** March 28, 2024 7:00 p.m.

On the night Jesus last gathered with his disciples, he took off his robe, took a towel, knelt down, and washed their feet; thus commanding them to love one another. During this service of worship, we remember Jesus' instruction to love one another through the ancient practices of hand-washing and anointing, as well as through the Lords' Supper.

The word Tenebrae is Latin for shadows. The purpose of the Tenebrae service is to recreate the emotional aspects of the passion story: the betrayal, abandonment, and agony of the events, and it is left unfinished, because the story isn't over until Easter Day. At the end of each reading a light will be extinguished, until all appears dark. And yet, the light of Christ will remain.

CALL TO WORSHIP

L: Jesus said: I give you a new commandment, that you love one another.

P: Just as Christ has loved us, let us love one another.

OPENING SENTENCES

People of God, this is the day when Christ, our Teacher and Lord, knelt down to wash his disciples' feet; showing us how to love and serve one another.

SECOND SCRIPTURE READING

I Corinthians 11:23-34

²³ For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread, ²⁴ and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." ²⁵ In the same way he took the cup also, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." ²⁶ For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes. ²⁷ Whoever, therefore, eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be answerable for the body and blood of the Lord. ²⁸ Examine yourselves, and only then eat of the bread and drink of the cup. ²⁹ For all who eat and drink without discerning the body eat and drink judgment against themselves. ³⁰ For this reason many of you are weak and ill, and some have died. ³¹ But if we judged ourselves, we would not be judged. ³² But when we are judged by the Lord, we are disciplined so that we may not be condemned along with the world. ³³ So

then, my brothers and sisters, when you come together to eat, wait for one another. ³⁴ If you are hungry, eat at home, so that when you come together, it will not be for your condemnation. About the other things I will give instructions when I come.
